## **Teacher Updates**

### Grade 7:

**Doucet & Porteous (Social Studies A & B)**: We are wrapping up our Explorers Project this week. Next week we will be shifting to look at the growth of New France and the beginning of the conflict with the English.

**Gammie (PE):** Students continue volleyball demonstrating outcomes in manipulative skills, functional fitness, communication and effort.

**Hatch (Science):** Students have recently completed their first unit test and will be moving onto the second unit, Plants for Food & Fibre in the coming week.

**Howard (Math):** Students are working through our Operations on Decimals unit where they get a chance to hone their previous skills involving addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division of decimal numbers.

**MacLachlan (ELA 7A):** We continue to work on our genre unit, "Oh, the Horror!" Students are working on elements of fiction, and we will begin a class novel study of "Goosebumps" shortly. **Porteous (ELA 7B):** We are working on our Horror Unit as well. Next week we are beginning our listen to some older radio plays to get an understanding of how media types can shape our interpretations of the story.

### Grade 8:

**Baxter (ELA A & B):** Students will continue to work on their "Creativity" projects. Our next assignment is the Remembrance Day activity/contest. Students need to read 20 minutes/day =120 minutes/ week.

**Gammie (PE):** Students continue volleyball demonstrating outcomes in manipulative skills, functional fitness, communication and effort.

**Hatch (Science):** Students have now moved onto our second unit, Cells & Systems, and will soon be entering the lab to work with microscopes and to learn proper techniques for preparing slides for examination.

**Henning (Social):** Students are learning about the impacts of trade on **Renaissance Era Italian City-States.** Next week will have students completing a Brochure detailing the benefits of trade within a chosen city.

**Howard (Math):** Students are working through our Integer Operations unit where they are building skills for multiplying and dividing Integers. This will be added to previous knowledge of adding and subtracting Integers at the end of the unit when we build order of operations skills.

## Grade 9:

**Baxter (ELA):** Students continue to work on their "Hero" projects. The next assignment is the Remembrance Day contest/assignment. Students need to read 20 minutes /day = 120 minutes/week.

**Anderson (Science):** Unit B 1.2 continued as students learn about matter and mixtures. See Powerschool for updated guiz marks.

**Gammie (PE):** Students continue volleyball demonstrating outcomes in manipulative skills, functional fitness, communication and effort.

**Porteous (Social Studies):** We are looking at the Charter of Rights and Freedoms. All marks for Unit 1 will be available by Friday PM, except for the exam. Once all exams are completed, those marks will be posted and we will review the concepts.

## Grade 10:

**Anderson (Science 10):** Students are learning about Unit B 1.1 Motion, 1.2 Velocity and 1.3 Acceleration. Reminder the next quiz is scheduled for Wed. Nov. 4th.

**Doucet (Social 10):** Next week, students will work on the issue two project. This project is a photo essay on the legacy of imperialism. afterward the students will write their unit two exam. **Howard (PE 10):** We are finished with outdoor units and have moved onto Box Lacrosse which is played inside. Manipulative skills as well as teamwork and fairplay are essential outcomes in this unit.

**MacLachlan (ELA 10):** We are almost done *Romeo & Juliet*, and should finish next week. We will be writing a reading comprehension test and an essay upon completion of the play. **Baxter (CALM):** We will be completing the Sexual Education unit next week. Students must be working on their Portfolio's - the halfway check-in is Nov 6.

## Grade 11:

**Anderson (Physics 20):** Reminder to students to study this weekend for their Chapter 3 and 4 test scheduled for next Tuesday, Nov 3rd. The Unit B "Dynamics" exam is scheduled for Thursday, Nov 5th.

**MacLachlan (ELA 20):** Students are writing our first critical essay this coming week, and will be writing and workshopping in class.
