Social 8 - Students are finishing up their brochures on a chosen Italian city-state based during the Renaissance. So far, these are looking great! It was exciting to read about how much of an impact these experiences have made for each student. Ask your child about which volunteering experience has been the most memorable and why!

Foods 7 - Students are continuing to work on their Foods Projects, as well as researching knife safety and how to use a peeler. We are all looking forward to making <u>Microwave Apple Crisp</u> this week. Ask your child how the recipe turned out for their group!

Foods 8/9 - Students are continuing to work on their Foods Projects, as well as researching knife skills and how to check if penne pasta is cooked. We are all looking forward to making <u>Pink Sauce Pasta</u> this week. Ask your child how the recipe turned out for their group!

A new list of course offerings for both Olds College and Lethbridge Polytechnic will be available in May for students to select courses for 2025-2026.
