Regarding staff allocation and Decanting:

- Staffing allocation is expected April 11
- Several upstairs rooms struggle with being too warm, solutions are being looked into to cool them down
- Storage considerations must be made for decanting. ie. where to house library books, etc.
- Surveys will be sent out to students regarding complimentary courses (Options). They
 may be given a cluster of different programs to choose from. Outdoor Ed. is also
 being considered
- Teachers thought quarterly sessions for Jr. High worked well and grouping grade 7,8 and 9's together was well received by parents
- Administration is trying to be as proactive as possible with the little information that they currently have. The schedule still needs some fine tuning
- Best case scenario: upstairs may be enough room for all JT Foster students with the exception of possibly moving band offsite to the Bomber Command
- · Busing will be minimized and students will absolutely not be bussed around all day
- Another possible scenario: all core classes remain upstairs at JT Foster, with options held elsewhere. We already have several off campus classes: hockey, golf and possibly Outdoor Ed.
